

Cyprus remains in the grip of Turkey with 38% of the island still under occupation after Turkey invaded in 1974. The north of Cyprus has been turned into a Turkish enclave governed by the Turkish military, directed solely by Turkey. The TRNC of the North is the result of Turkish financing, military occupation and political Turkish propaganda endorsed by its allies. Coulentianos was one of the most influential, innovative and renowned sculptors of mid-twentieth century Greece and European art. Well respected in Europe and the USA, his dynamic and vigorous sculptures decorate many public places in France, Greece and America and also form part of the collection of the nation in the National Gallery in Athens, Greece as well as important private collections of Greek art.

The recent exhibition on the artist at the Benaki Museum, Athens in 2012-13, "The Last of the Modern Acrobats", has shed more light on the significance of the artist in Greek and international art. From realist art, to abstraction (as shown in the work of our exhibition/collection) Coulentianos has reconnected the contribution of Greek sculpture to the world from ancient times to today.



ARCHBISHOP MAKARIOS


Vasilis Zenetzis had a soft spot for Cyprus and her people, as he always told me and assured me. The work in this exhibition is the artistic explosion of a real Greek for the island of Cyprus and its struggles to FREEDOM from the perennial enemy, the Turks. Being a descendant of Greeks from Asia Minor disaster, he knew what suffering his family went through; the loss of home and lands and the difficult journey on to a new life and a new beginning, Zenetzis lived the drama of Cyprus and depicted it graphically, before and after the invasion.



There are leaders who are forgotten soon after they cease to be leaders and there are those whose presence is still felt after their passing away and NEVER FORGOTTEN.

Archbishop Makarios (1913-1977) President Makarios, was a towering figure in Cyprus between 1950 and 1977. He led the political arm of EOKA for independence of Cyprus from the British Empire and led the newly founded Republic of Cyprus in 1960 as its first President.

In spite of the unfortunate events between 1960-1974 that led to the Turkish invasion of Cyprus in 1974 with all its tragic consequences, President Makarios is still cherished by Cypriots today. He was the Religious leader who loved Cyprus and its people, obtained their Freedom and Democracy, but was ultimately undermined by bigger players and powers. His passing away was a major loss for Cyprus and especially the Greeks of Cyprus.



Saint John's Church is the Cathedral Church of Nicosia and the Archbishopric of Cyprus. Next to it stands the old Archbishop Palace, now a museum. Exactly behind the exquisitely decorated with frescoes and icons old church of Saint John is the Museum of Archbishop Makarios, founded by the late Archbishop. The museum houses a very good collection of important icons, good quality Greek art and Cypriot art of today.

The new Archbishop's Palace is to the left of Saint John's Church. The history of the Church of Cyprus lies within the perimeter of this painting but not far away from Saint John's Cathedral are other beautiful churches with their own history of centuries and their own beauty and ancient icons.





In a letter related to the painting the artist explains the universal love of Mother to Son and the symbolic elements he employed to compose the work, such as the butterflies, the flowers, the significance of the blues and red colours.

The painting synthesises Byzantine and Modern traditions of painting and concepts of mother's love to Son, thus revealing the humanity of the artist and his concerns about a modern world, where fundamental concepts and traditions lost much of their power and significance in modern life.

KYRENIA ALWAYS GREEK, NEVER TURKISH


The town of Kyrenia lies to the north of Cyprus on the Mediterranean coast. Since 1974 and the Turkish invasion of Cyprus, it has been occupied by Turkey and turned into a Turkish city within Cyprus. The Greek Cypriot inhabitants were expelled from the city in 1974 and replaced with illegal immigrants brought from Turkey by Turkey.

The picturesque city of Kyrenia has been the main city of illegal TRNC but also the focus and symbol of never ending struggle of the Greeks of the island to free it from Turkish occupation troops and governance of Turkey via proxy of the Turkish Cypriot TRNC.

This exhibition is not just to show paintings related to Cyprus and its people but more to shout out that Cyprus deserves support of the whole FREE, DEMOCRATIC world. It deserves to be FREE, DEMOCRATIC AND INDEPENDENT, without occupying troops and bases on the island ordering it about and threatening its people.

Never has an island been so blatantly invaded, occupied and criminally demographically changed by Turkey to suit Turkey and its expansionist plans in Eastern Mediterranean and Middle East.





BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE OF ARTISTS

ANDREADIS, ANTONIS (1948-2007)

Andreadis studied History of Art at Yiannina University. He soon found himself painting and the calling was final. He became one of the most successful figurative painters of Modern Greek art but his premature death was a blow to his art and Greek art. We are grateful he undertook the commission to paint the people of Cyprus in 2003.

CHRYSOCHOS, ANDREAS (1929-)

The most senior Greek Cypriot artist of Cyprus. Chrysochos studied in London and was for many years an art teacher at the Paedagogical Academy of Cyprus, where I first met him as a student back in the late 1960s. Chrysochos' work is well regarded and collected in Cyprus. He is recognised as one of the most influential artists in Cyprus with a number of his works in the top galleries such as The National Gallery , Athens and The Archbishop Makarios Gallery in Nicosia, Cyprus.

COULENTIANOS, COSTAS (1918-1995)

Coulentianos showed exceptional talent from early age. He found himself in Paris in the 1950s where he met and came under the influence of many important French artists. His work represents various stages of sculpture developments in Europe from representative to abstraction. Coulentianos is well regarded by international collectors and curators thus his work is found all over the world and in important collections and museums. Huge constructions of his decorate public places in Greece, France and USA.

GEORGARAS, MARINOS (1952-)

Georgaras was born in Zante. He travelled the world and studied art in Australia. He lives and works in Zante today. His work is distinguished for its bright colours and idiomatic cubism.


ZENETZIS, VASILIS (1935-2016)

Zenetzis started his artistic career in Crete where as early as seventeen years old, he exhibited at the Theotokopoulos Gallery in Crete. He had numerous exhibitions in Greece, London and USA where many collectors have his work.

Zenetzis visited the museums of Europe in early 1970 and was profoundly influenced by the work of Van Gogh. That influence is quite evident in his work and he himself always used to say, "I am the Van Gogh of Greece"

Vasilis Zenetzis is the most accomplished Greek impressionist of the last forty years with work of his in major collections and Museums all over the world. His work has been recognised by major collectors and the major auctions of the world, Sothebys, Bonhams and Christies. Zenetzis painted the antiquities of Athens on many occasions as well as the areas around Athens, such as Pireus, Vouliagmeni and Sounion.

However, the artistic creation of Zenetzis that stands out above all other work are the Seven Paintings he produced during the Athens Olympics 2004 on location and while the event was taking place!!! For eightteen days Zenetzis worked to immortalise the antiquities of Athens amongst millions of tourists, who admired his work. The Magnificent Seven Zenetzis produced during those eighteen days are now part of Athens history and culture.
